

What to Pack for the Road Trip When Traveling with the Family for a Shooting Competition

Things we keep in the car every day:

Bug spray

Fix a flat

Umbrella

Travel air compressor (because ranges are sometimes remote, and you have to get there and get home)

Sunscreen

First aid kit

Eyedrops (for dusty ranges)

Painkiller

Spare shoes

Jackets

Hats

Gloves

Rain gear

Socks (yes, kids leave home without socks)

Ziploc bags for sorting gauged ammo or storing food

Trash bags for emergency rain gear and trash or wet clothes

Tarp – to cover guns at match when they're on preload tables and it's raining, or for covering gear from dust

Food we pack for our travels:

Snacks, such as protein, carbs, fats (jerky, nuts, crackers, cookies, chips, peanut butter)

Water

Energy drink

Water bottle

Sports drink powder

Mags

Ear protection

Eye protection
